Description	The course is for students who do not major in mathematics.
Tentative content	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Basics and definition of differential equation2. Integration techniques (substitution, integration by parts, partial fraction decomposition of rational functions)3. Separation of variables4. Linear differential equations of first order5. Solution via substitution (Euler homogeneous, Riccati, Bernoulli differential equation)6. Linear differential equations of higher order7. Linear differential equations with constant coefficients8. Existence and uniqueness of solutions
Teaching Method	Lecture, exercises.
Evaluation	Midterm (8th week, 75 minutes, 30 % of final score); Final exam (15th week, 75 minutes, 30 % of final score); Assignment sheets (30 % of final score); Attendance (10 % of final score). Students must solve exercises regularly, and will be given assignment sheets every week.
